FREE THROW VIOLATIONS: PROCEDURE



Upon recognition of a free throw violation the following procedures will apply:

- 1) When you recognize the violation, blow your whistle <u>after</u> the ball is released
- 2) Whenever the referee blows their whistle, this creates an opportunity for a substitution or time out.
 - The referee shall handle the ball for the ensuing throw in.
- If the violation is on the free throw shooter and the free throw is successful;
 - a) Free throw shall be cancelled
 - b) Throw-in shall be awarded to the opponents from the FT line extended (unless a further FT or possession is to be administered)

FREE THROW VIOLATIONS: PROCEDURE



There will probably be a few questions arising from Art. 10

- 10.2 says the ball becomes live when during a free throw, the ball is at the disposal of the free throw shooter
- 10.3 says the ball becomes dead when a referee blows their whistle while the ball is live
- 10.4 says the ball does not become dead and the goal counts if made when the ball is in flight on a free throw and a referee blows their whistle for any rule infraction other than by the free throw shooter.

We are instructing that the referee should handle the ball because they had blown their whistle, even if the free throw counts.
